According to the judges, the opening notes of our band's performance were "strong" and "confident" and the young musicians' pleasure was evident as they relaxed and got into the swing of things.

All the hard work paid off, with a memorable performance of the hymn *Aurelia*- the only band to succeed in capturing the dynamic and correct phrasing, according to the judges.

We were then treated to a first class performance of *Tragedy* by the Bee Gees and two songs from the musical *The Lion King; Can You Feel The Love* and *Circle of Life* to complete their programme.

A rapturous applause broke out across the hall as the youngsters took their bows.

When the announcement came that Beaumaris had won, I'm sure everyone on Anglesey must have heard the noise that filled the hall! It was another special day and more evidence of the talent in our family of bands. To beat some of the best bands in Britain was quite an achievement.
