The bands are planning various fundraising events and we hope to continue to have your valuable support. We want to widen the circle by recruiting more Friends and resume fundraising, supporting and publicising activities. Meanwhile, thank you to all current Friends for your continuing support.

Fundraising is so important because while the bands' activities were curtailed over recent years, unavoidable expenses continued. The opportunity was taken for some much needed repairs, carried out on the band room in 2021 and 2022, some of it structural and urgent.

Congratulations



March has seen two successful competition performances by the Senior and Youth Bands. On the 18th the Senior Band came second in the Welsh Region First Section competition in Swansea, qualifying the band to compete in the National Brass Band Championships in September.

The following weekend saw the Youth band triumphing in Stockport, where they became British Champions in the Performance Section of the National Youth Brass Band Championships of Great Britain, with Osian Maloney being awarded the best soloist award.

News Catch-up

The Covid 19 lockdown interrupted the Bands' activities and the activities of the Friends of The Band. Despite this, quite a lot has happened since the last newsletter ...

2020

Back before the pandemic stopped the world in its tracks, Bari Gwilliam took over the reins as Senior Band Musical Director at the beginning of 2020 and the band promptly won the Third Section of the Welsh Championships in Swansea. According to the adjudicator, "Beaumaris was in a class of its own". Katherine Gaunt won the instrumentalist prize on the baritone.

This success followed on from great success at the North Wales Solo and Ensemble contest where band members (junior to senior) won twelve prizes and Beaumaris won Band of the Day.

Sadly the Lockdown prevented the Youth Band from displaying their talents in the European Championships in Lithuania.

In August 400 members of 31 choirs and 13 brass bands took part in the "Pont y Glaw" project for the Eisteddfod AmGen creating one piece of music over Zoom, coordinated from the Beaumaris Band studio (see <u>links</u> on Facebook and Friends website). Rehearsals also resumed in the summer, socially distanced on Beaumaris Green,

but continuing lockdown restrictions meant that only Bari could represent the band on Remembrance Sunday and there was no Christmas Concert in December. 2021

After the 3rd (and last?) lockdown, socially distanced rehearsals resumed *again* in May, in the Church, Canolfan and school. This was to good effect as at the end of May, the Senior Band won Section 3 of the 'Whit Friday Marches' virtual contest, organised by Foden's band.

In August there were successes at the National Eisteddfod 2021 with wins in Sections 2 & 3. This was followed by the Senior Band achieving second place in the National Championships in Cheltenham, securing promotion to the Second Section.

The Senior Band started the year fantastically well by becoming Second Section Champions in the Regional Championship competition held in Swansea.

Back at home, in early May the bands came together to march out for the first time since Lockdowns began, proudly leading the town Beating the Bounds. And another post-lockdown first was the Summer Concert in July, much enjoyed by all.

July also saw the band going from strength to strength, winning Section Two in the National Eisteddfod. Further success with a third place in Section Two at the National Brass Band Championships in Cheltenham, meant promotion to the First Section 2023.

It was great to see four ex-Beaumaris members playing in the National Finals in the Albert Hall for other bands.

At the end of the year, bands enthusiastically came together at the fireworks and the first live Christmas Concert for three years, as well as the normal Carols around the town and Anglesey.
