In addition to making music, all the bands have played their part in various fundraising activities: Wine & Cheese, Cawl a Chân, Bingo, Craft Fairs. A big 'Thank you' to all who were able to attend any of them. A priority goal for the New Year is to raise sufficient funds to send the Youth Band to Palanga, Lithuania in Spring next year. As National Champions they will be representing Wales at the European Youth Brass Band Championships. A fantastic and deserved achievement, enabled by all those who support the Beaumaris Band family.

The 'Friends' are an important part of that support, and this year we have covered the repair costs of instruments including 2 Bb Basses (a four-figure sum that the band could not have otherwise afforded).

It was great to welcome in June friends from Norway as former Musical Director Gwyn Evans returned to the town with the *Tanager-Haland & Dysjaland Skolerkorps*. The band played in the castle before joining the Beaumaris Youth Band on Castle Square. The day ended with some games on the Green and a barbecue at the bandroom ... and for once, the rain stayed away!

The Junior and Intermediate bands played at the annual Summer concert in July. They all work very hard in rehearsal and are a credit to Seindorf Beaumaris Band. The audience really loved seeing and listening to the junior band's programme, most of the band are under 8 years old but you wouldn't think so to hear them!

The audience also enjoyed the intermediate band's programme which had a surprise guest whilst playing the Doctor Who theme tune – yes, it was a life size Dalek that tried to exterminate a few people, lucky it only sprayed water, ha!

To finish off a very successful term the Junior and Intermediate band enjoyed a BBQ at the bandroom as a thank you for all their hard work!
