Youth Band

However, this year they found time in April for a 'side-by-side' concert with the Cardiff and Vale Youth brass band at the Canolfan. They really enjoyed it and it was especially good to welcome Cardiff's conductor Charles Maynard who is a former young member of Beaumaris Band.

The highpoint of the year was surely in August at the National Eisteddfod in Wrexham, where the Youth Band won their section with an outstanding performance, which means once again they have qualified to represent Wales at the European Youth Brass Band Championships in Austria next year. Many congratulations!

A couple of special mentions: We are so proud of our eight current and one past member who worked hard in August playing in the National Youth Brass Band of Wales – a fantastic achievement and what a great contribution from the Seindorf Beaumaris Band family.

Senior Band

In March the Senior Band gave a great performance competing at the Welsh Regional Championships in Swansea. It was an incredibly strong 1st Section and while they came a

disappointing 7th they had a great time and enjoyed the piece.

The band also played in May at the Ynys Mon Eisteddfod in Beaumaris. They were proud to play at the ceremony to honour the Tlws y Cerddor (Musician's Prize) and the Tlws yr Ifanc (Young Person's Literary Prize), when they played the especially commissioned new march 'Castell Beaumaris' – a fitting tribute. The audience were wowed by the piece and it received a standing ovation before the band had even finished playing the last note! The new work was selected in a competition and the chairman of the judges was former Beaumaris Band music director Gwyn Evans.

In August the band competed at the National Eisteddfod in Wrexham, coming a creditable second, and in November they gave a wonderful and moving Remembrance concert on the weekend of Remembrance Sunday.
